

Robert Llewellyn of Bristleton named as a debtor in the will of Thomas Emerson, yeoman of Cold Ashton. [Will proved PCC 1586]

1587, October 18

Robert Summers, son of Robert of Brislington, carpenter, apprenticed to Thomas Holden as a baker. [BRO Apprentices]

1588, October 8

John Eyton, son of John Eyton of Bussleton, apprenticed to John Batten, junior, and Mary his wife, as a hooper. [BRO, Bristol Apprentices]

1589/90 January 25

Nicholas Puckslye, son of John Puckslye of Brislington apprenticed to Edward & Mary Langford, as a draper. [BRO, Bristol Apprentices]

1590, August 4 com a responsibilitativity pina ware equal level of years a tribitive sales distilluis)

Thomas Whitinge, son of William Whitinge of Brislington apprenticed to William & Jane Howe as a carpenter. [BRO, Bristol Apprentices]

1592, May 30

John Ithell son of Richard Ithell, yeoman of Bussleton apprenticed to John & Elizabeth Tirrell, as a weaver. [BRO, Bristol Apprentices]

Wandering Women, 1566-1600

1566/7, February 12

"A poor woman's child that was delivered at Puxley's house, was christened."

1590/1, February 14

"A child born at Beresbridge of a woman who came thither by chance, baptised. The child was buried the next Thursday, after the woman went."

1592, May 1

"Johan, daughter of a poore woman who was borne at Henry Deane's house, baptised.".

1593, May 27

Tymothe, son of a woman from Lapforde's Gate. Born at William Payne's howse, baptised. (NB Lawford's Gate in Old Market Street, Bristol, St Philip & St Jacob's).

1593, June 20

"Mary, daughter of a strange woman. Born at Richard Ithell's howse, baptised." The strange woman "that by her accounts came out of Glousheere" did not survive the birth, and was buried the same day. Nothing further is mentioned of the child.

And wandering men.....

1596/7, March 21

"A certain impotent man which came from whence it is not known was buried owt of the howse of Richard Ithell, it was supposed he came from about Bradford in Wiltshere, was buried."

1597, August 26

"A poore man that dwelt for some tyme in the Church howse, buried."

Addenda to Brislington Bulletins No. 2

Marriages at Brislington, 1600-1699 were omitted from Brislington Bulletins No. 2. NB. There is a gap between 1640 and 1661 (except for one entry in 1659) due to the English Civil War when church weddings were suspended. Marriages were conducted by a Register, but his records have not survived for Brislington. Marriage entries for other years appear to have been erratic.

"William Williams, child of Thomas, a glasse carrier, of Bradford, baptised." (and the family came too. Would it have been sheets of window glass carried by cart?).

1616, November 29

Indenture between (1) Tobias Pope of Brislington, husbandman and (2) Michael Pope of Bristol, sopemaker (sic) regarding a tenement in Brislington, formerly occupied by Thomas Whippie, deceased, and late in occupation of his wife. Anne Whippie, also deceased, now in occupation of Tobias Pope, situated in Brislington, called Eastwood. [SRO DD/SX/10/1]

1622, June 20

Jane Parsell, a child of John, was buried at "at St Anne's, in capello", so though the chapel building was disappearing fast, the burial ground appears to have still been occasionally used.

When Sir John Lacy became Lord of the Manor in 1640, copyhold tenants held most of the land. In about 1660, Rowland Lacy his son and heir enfranchised the copyhold lands of the Manor reserving as part consideration for the enfranchisements a small fee in farm rents amounting to £65. 4s.8d per annum, and also of the coal underlying the lands. (Nearby Kingswood at the same time was involved in endless lawsuits concerning its coal deposits.) The following men received grants of such enfranchised lands:

1661, April 3

Most of Brislington's locally proved wills were destroyed by enemy action during the 2nd World War, but this one is a magnificent survivor in the Somerset Record Office.

Thomas Ithell of Brislington, yeoman, made his will, referring to all his tenements and lands, meadows, cottages lying in the Westend of Brislington with orchard and paddock thereto belonging to his wife Mary during her widowhood. Thereafter to his son Thomas and his heirs, and for want of heirs to son John and his heirs and for want of heirs to son Gyles (etc. down the line) and then to son Joseph. If Thomas survived his mother he was to pay "flower good pounds apiece of the lawfull money of England to his sisters Mary and Johan, either at 21 or when they married. Also, John was to have a tenement called Brokes in reversion of the said Broke and his daughter; Gyles was to have a tenement called Rawlings held by Priscilla Rawlings, widow, and Dorothy Bayliffe (Probably Bayliss). Joseph was to have a cottage in Lower Bowood. Daughter Mary was to have £40 at 21 and daughter Johan £30 at 21. Mary his wife was to be sole executrix.

Thomas Ithell made his mark, and the will was witnessed by Israel Gleson and George Feare.

(The Westend of Brislington was presumably the area we now know as West Town.)

Thomas Ithell was a prosperous man. The inventory of his chattels, taken by George Feare and William Tibbott amounted to £316. 9s.6d and included:

Wearing apparel and money in his purse £6.0.0d In the lower chamber, 1 feather bed and bolster, 2 feather pillows, 1 rug and half head bolster and mat 3 boxes. £5

In the hall and chamber 2 flock beds with bolsters 4 double beds 2 pair of blankets and awning, one bedstead and half head bolster with board, 3 mats

A headed bedstead with board, 3 mats, 2 coffers 1 tub, 5 buckles and mantle and working saddle with a bridle, one pillion, 200 weight of cheese, 30 pounds of wool, £8.4. 0d In the buttery 9 harrows, 6 rakes, 1 churn.....2 bushels of meal.....£3

In the hall one carpet, one baton rake with two flitches of bacon, one rack, 3 chairs, 2 stools.....3 tongs, 3 crooks, £2.10.0d

Rate brought in £65.3s.4d - 68 parishioners. Thomas Langton esquire, £5.13s 0d. Mr Joseph Langton in occupation £3.2s.0d. Occupiers of Parsonage £4.5s.0d. [BRO, Brislington Overseers]






